I. Call to Order: President Bill Cooper

President Bill Cooper called the meeting to order at 12:02 PM.

II. Roll Call

III. Opening Remarks: President Bill Cooper

President Bill Cooper welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the meeting.

IV. Review and Approval of the WVMCCD Foundation Board Minutes: April 27, 2020

Action Item: President Bill Cooper

 Treasurer Bill McFarland made a motion to approve the minutes with the correction of Dan Furtado's attendance of the April 27, 2020 Foundation Board meeting. Mark Waxman seconded the motion. Motion passed with unanimous decision.

V. Finance Committee Report: Treasurer Bill McFarland

- 1. Review and Approval of the Foundation Financials, Q4 (Unaudited), April June 2020
 - Treasurer Bill McFarland reviewed the Foundation Financials from April June 2020. See attached report for details.

Action Item: Treasurer Bill McFarland

- Len Duncan made a motion to approve the unaudited financials from April June 2020 as presented. Mark Waxman seconded the motion. Motion passed with unanimous decision.
- 2. Lindbrook Investment Report
 - Treasurer Bill McFarland presented the quarterly investment report.

VI. President's Report: President Bill Cooper

 President Bill Cooper explained that there is about six acres of unused land in Santa Clara County near Deer Path and Brooker Creek that was gifted to Land Corp. He would like to suggest to them that they sell the land and convert the money to be used for scholarships. President Bill Cooper also reported that he would like to reactivate the scholarship committee to make sure the board has insight into the scholarship program.

VII. Reports

- 1. District Chancellor Brad Davis
 - Chancellor Brad Davis thanked the Foundation Finance Committee for their incredible work and dedication to the Foundation. He reported that the Foundation's performance is doing better than our peer institutions and he thanked the entire board for their diligent work.
 - Chancellor Brad Davis provided an update that the organizational structure and model that the District isgoing

to support the Foundation has changed from a bifurcated model where there are individual advancement directors at each college back to the model of one executive director of Advancement for the District that will support both colleges. Nicole Aguinaldo will continue to assist the Foundation and Advancement function. He thanked Nicole Aguinaldo and Joanne Cao for their great work as the Office of Advancement transitions to its original organizational structure.

- Chancellor Brad Davis further explained that the District doubled its investment in its Advancement function but
 had the two of the lowest performing years in terms of bringing in external funding. He hopes that as we refine
 our organizational structure and hire a new director that we will be able to raise more money and engage our
 communities in the most productive way.
- He then gave an update that both colleges quickly moved to an online format and in the last number of months the District as refined their scheduling, training for faculty in delivering online instruction, focus on student needs and technology. He reported that the enrollment of Summer was very healthy, although the enrollment for Fall is trending a little bit flat. He hopes that the numbers will continue to grow as students are considering their option in an online format if other public and private colleges are offering online instruction only.
- Chancellor Brad Davis noted that one of the biggest focus that we've had this year and for the coming years will be on responding to issues of social equity and injustices.

2. Mission College — President Daniel Peck

• VP Administrative Services Danny Nguyen gave the Mission College report for President Daniel Peck. President Daniel Peck was absent at this board meeting because he was on leave. VP Danny Nguyen reported that Mission is focusing on a return to campus planning and hopefully bringing back some in person classes. Mission's priority is to identify critical things that students need access to have a successful Fall semester. This includes support for online instruction, food, basic needs, technology, mental health and wellness. He also noted that Mission is trying to leverage all of their resources to ensure students are successful through the Cares Act funding, categorical funding from the state, Foundation funding and scholarships. VP Danny Nguyen then gave an update that the construction for the new plaza at Mission is about 60-70% complete and will be completed at the end of October, early November. He explained that the plaza will be a tremendous naming opportunity.

3. West Valley College – President Stephanie Kashima

- President Stephanie Kashima thanked the Foundation Board and staff for the incredible work and for
 volunteering their time. She reported that West Valley received a \$50,000 donation from the Ehlers family.
 Gretchen Ehlers is the West Valley Faculty Senate President and math faculty member and when her
 mother passed away last year, her father and brother decided to donate \$50,000. \$20,000 will be an
 endowment for scholarships and \$30,000 will go to the emergency needs for students.
- President Stephanie Kashima noted that West Valley now has an Office of Student Needs that supports
 homeless students and foster youth who are in need of cash, toiletries and other items. She showed the
 Office of Student Needs website that shows the number of different resources that have been distributed
 to students in need.
- She then explained how West Valley is engaging in robust work on addressing social justice issues. West
 Valley also has a new partnership with the College of Adaptive Arts, an organization that offers higher
 college level classes in arts, theater, music and dance to adults with disabilities, to offer 10 internships for
 students to assist in the program. Lastly, she reported that West Valley is addressing the return to campus
 planning.

Treasurer Bill McFarland reported on the top donations from FY19-20 (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020).
