

# WVMCCD FOUNDATION BOARD MEETING Monday, January 24, 2022 12:00 – 1:30 PM

# **APPROVED MINUTES**

- I. Call to Order: President Bill Cooper
  - President Bill Cooper called the meeting to order at 12:04 PM.
- II. Roll Call: Advancement Management Assistant Nicole Aguinaldo
- III. Review of WVMCCD Foundation Board Minutes: October 25, 2021 Action Item: Approval of Minutes, President Bill Cooper
  - Mark Waxman made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 25, 2021 Foundation Board meeting. Dan Schettler seconded the motion. **Motion passed with unanimous decision.**
- IV. Finance Committee Report: Treasurer Bill McFarland
  - Review of Foundation Financials, Q2 (Unaudited), October December 2021 Action Item: Approval of Q2 Financials, Treasurer Bill McFarland
    - Bill Cooper made a motion to approve the unaudited financials from October December 2021 as presented. Jackie Costanzo seconded the motion. **Motion passed with unanimous decision.**
  - 2. Lindbrook Investment Report
    - Treasurer Bill McFarland presented the quarterly investment report from Q4 (October December 2021).
- V. President's Report: President Bill Cooper

## VI. Reports

- 1. Office of Advancement: Executive Director Melissa Johns
  - First, Melissa Johns reported on the end-of-year campaign strategy and highlights: Approximately 380 letters mailed from various Year-End Mailings, \$38,358 in total donations were received from Year-End Mailings, more than \$750,000 was received in major gifts, and more than \$3,000 raised through a crowdfunding campaign for the new AAPI for Black Lives Scholarship. Next, Melissa reported on the Foundation Fund Consolidation.

<u>Action Item</u>: Approval to combine the underfunded Mission College Scholarships to make one Mission College Legacy Endowment Fund and combine the underfunded West Valley College Scholarships to make one West Valley College Legacy Endowment Fund.

- Bill Cooper made a motion to approve combining the underfunded endowments to make Legacy Endowment Funds. Jackie Costanzo seconded the motion. Motion passed with unanimous decision.
- $\circ$  Melissa explained the 2022 Scholarship Cycle timeline and announced the dates of the Virtual

Scholarship Celebrations. Then Melissa reported that the Office of Advancement developed an Honorary Naming Policy for the WVM District. The naming policy will replace the existing Board Policy 6620: Naming of Facilities and Other Naming Opportunities. The new policy has a gift size matrix that enables the Foundation to have a menu of gift options. Melissa gave an update on the progress of the new Foundation Web Site project. The launch date of the web site is in July 2022. Lastly, Melissa reported on the Foundation's accounting timeline.

- 2. District: Chancellor Brad Davis
  - Chancellor Brad Davis stated that the District is experiencing an enrollment decline. In an effort to
    respond to the enrollment decline, the District is offering a supplemental early retirement program,
    administrative consolidation of business functions at the District, opening 60-70% of courses across
    the two colleges to be in person, and enforcing a mandatory vaccination policy. Next, Chancellor Brad
    Davis provided an update that the Mission College President search was a failed search. Norma
    Ambriz-Galaviz was appointed as interim president appointed.
- **3.** West Valley College: President Stephanie Kashima (Report presented by Marilyn Morikang, Vice President of Administrative Services at West Valley College)
  - Marilyn Morikang highlighted on West Valley College's success of fundraising: \$150K for the Parsons Fashion and Styling Innovation Fund from the Michael and Alyce Parsons Foundation, \$120k for the Susie Rodriguez Fund for Park Management from Michael Fortwengler and Lalana Pundisto, and commitment of \$200k to the Gousha Memorial Endowment for Veterans, Gousha Veterans Scholarship Endowment, Office of Student Needs Fund, and Richard and Catherine Gousha Educators Scholarship endowment from Cathie and Jeff Thermond. Next, Marilyn reported on the following items: West Valley College received accreditation from National Association School of Music, the Women's Water Polo team won the state championship, the Food Pantry and Career Closet will open Spring 2022, President Kashima will be featured in the next issue of Los Gatos Living and Saratoga Outlook, Spring semester is opening with 60-70% of in person classes, and West Valley College is engaging in a robust outreach and marketing plan to increase enrollment.
